BEECHER CHAMBER OF COMMERCE 6TH ANNUAL LIGHTING UP DIXIE HIGHWAY


The Beecher Chamber of Commerce will be having their annual "Lighting Up Dixie Highway" again this year.

(Tree purchase required to be eligible for decorating contest.)


Trees must be purchased by November 5th.

The chart above gives a visual representation of where each of your property tax dollars ended up in 2024. The Village of Beecher receives 11% of the property tax you pay. Other local governments receive more or less. The Village has other options for obtaining revenue, such as income taxes, sales taxes and water and sewer fees. The fire and school districts rely on the property tax as their main source of revenue which is why they receive a higher percentage.

Only those in the Village of Beecher limits will have "Village of Beecher" listed on their tax bill. If Village of Beecher is not listed on your tax bill, then you would be considered in unincorporated Will County and would not pay taxes to the Village.

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

Protect Water Quality in Your Own Yard in Every Season!


In the Fall

 Gardens need bedcovers. When cleaning out vegetable and flower gardens, don't leave the soil bare for the winter. Use chopped leaves as mulch or plant a "green mulch" to add nutrients and organic matter to the soil.




- Plant! Early autumn is the best time to transplant shrubs and other perennials and to reseed lawns. Choose grass seed mixes that match your site. Consider adding a little clover seed for a free source of nitrogen fixation. Early autumn is the best time for a single dose of fertilizer for good grass root growth and a healthy lawn next spring. Slow-release or organic fertilizers stay where plants can use them and out of the local waters and wells. Keep watering all new plantings until the ground is frozen to give the roots plenty of opportunity to grow.
- Save the leaves. Leaves have lots of landscaping uses. Make a compost pile, chop them and mulch the landscaping and garden beds, or create new beds under the trees from which they fell. If your property is just too small and the town has community composting, use it, but go back for

your leaf mulch next spring.

CURBSIDE LEAF COLLECTION

The cooler weather has arrived and leaf raking season is here again! Leaves raked in rows along the curbside are picked up by a large vacuum machine used by Public Works crews until the end of November (depending on the weather).

Residents should place leaves in a pile or row in the parkway, between the sidewalk and curb as near to the street as possible. Leaves should not be placed in the streets because it will clog storm drains when it rains, potentially causing flooding. In areas without curbs, leaves should be placed in long rows on the grass or parkway at the edge of the street. Do not mix leaves with branches or grass clippings. These things will damage the leaf machine.

SNOW PARKING REGULATIONS DURING WINTER WEATHER

Even though many of us don't want to think about that white stuff, with winter approaching, the Village wants to remind residents that "It shall be unlawful to park any vehicle on any public street in the Village at any time within a twenty-four (24) hour period following a snowfall of two inches (2") or more. Such prohibited parking on any public street shall include the paved portion of any roadway or thoroughfare and also the paved portion of any Village-owned right of way adjacent to such roadway in a business district." This does not include parkways maintained by residents.



It is also illegal to deposit snow onto public streets. When clearing your driveway, direct the snow into the yard and not the street. Remember, the snow will end up back in your driveway anyway when the plow comes back by! The Police Department may issue tickets to those that deposit their snow onto the street.


DOG TAGS GO ON SALE MONDAY, DECEMBER 2ND



Dog tags go on sale Monday, December 2nd. The price is \$10 per dog and the deadline for purchase is March 14, 2025. After the March 14th deadline, the price of dog tags increases. Tags may be purchased at the Village Hall or online by clicking on the "ePay" option on the Village website. The dog's name, breed, color and date of last rabies vaccination will be required to purchase the tag. If you pay online, the tags will be mailed to you.

Dog tag fees are used to pay for the services provided by the Beecher Veterinary Clinic for picking up, feeding and boarding stray animals and lost pets.
