President Meyer called the meeting to order.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

President Meyer asked for consideration of the minutes of the January 27, 2025 Board meeting. Trustee Kraus made a motion to approve the minutes as written. Trustee Diachenko seconded.

VILLAGE CLERK REPORT

A report was provided on tax revenue received in January, 2025.

VILLAGE PRESIDENT REPORT

ORDINANCE #1416 – An Ordinance authorizing a moratorium on the collection of certain new residential building permit fees. The moratorium is only for cash in lieu of land for parks and cash in lieu of land for schools from February 10th until May 1, 2025. Trustee Gardner made a motion to approve Ordinance #1416. Trustee Tieri seconded.

PLANNING, BUILDING AND ZONING COMMITTEE

The Building Department monthly report was provided for review.

Pete Iosue, Village Planner from Teska Associates, was present and provided a report on the revised Zoning Ordinance and map. Committee meetings were held over the course of the last year to go through the ordinance to update and make changes. No major changes were made to the Zoning Ordinance. Revisions were needed to take into account new laws and to integrate all changes made over the last 20 years. The Zoning Ordinance will be codified and be available online. The PZC held a public hearing on January 23, 2025. They reviewed the ordinance, made some minor modifications, and voted unanimously to recommend approval of the proposed Zoning Ordinance with the changes made. Trustee Gardner made a motion authorizing the Village Attorney to draft an ordinance adopting the proposed Zoning Ordinance and amending the Zoning District map. Trustee Tieri seconded.

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A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT FOR THE PURCHASE OF ELECTRICITY FROM THE LOWEST COST ELECTRICITY PROVIDER FOR THE PURPOSES OF COMMERCIAL ACCOUNTS THROUGH THE NORTHERN ILLINOIS MUNICIPAL ELECTRIC COLLABORATIVE BID PROCESS

WHEREAS, the Village of Beecher, Will County, Illinois ("Village") has previously joined the Northern Illinois Municipal Collaborative (NIMEC) for the purpose of procuring electricity through a cooperative pool in order to receive a more competitive bid price on electricity. NIMEC's membership consists of 160+ northern Illinois governmental organization;

WHEREAS, the Village through its participation in the NIMEC bid process has previously entered into contracts with the lowest bidder for electricity for the Village's facilities;

WHEREAS, Commonwealth Edison no longer offers a fixed rate for only smaller sized accounts. ComEd prices larger sized accounts on a floating market rate that changes every hour. It is not possible to predict those rates for the following 12 months, as they are dependent upon weather, usage and other market factors. Fixed rates for medium and large sized accounts are only available from suppliers other than ComEd; and

WHEREAS, because commodity pricing is volatile, the Village Administrator will need to have the authority to sign a contract with the electricity provider which is deemed most favorable for the Village on the same day that bids are presented by NIMEC, and determine if the desired contract should be for a one, two or three-year term; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of the Village of Beecher, Will County, Illinois, now deem it advisable, necessary, and in the best interests of the residents of the Village of Beecher to authorize the Village Administrator to sign the contract with the lowest bidder on the day that bids are received by NIMEC.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Beecher, Will County, Illinois, as follows:

Section One: That, in light of the time constraints applicable to the acceptance of a competitive bid for a supply of electricity, once the bids are received by NIMEC, the Village Administrator, Charity Mitchell, is hereby authorized to sign the contract with the lowest bidder. Further, said contract shall be placed on the first available Village Board meeting following the execution thereof by the Village Administrator for ratification by the Village Board.




